Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - UW

WHEG - UW committed 142.64% (\$83,221,310) of its appropriation with 42,083 calculated awards. This is 1,313 fewer calculated awards and 7.81% less committed than at this time last year. HEAB no longer applies "W" codes to WHEG-UW. Each campus has an allocation and they determine their own cut-off point for awards. In 2012-13 the program had committed 150.45% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 3,050 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - WTC

WHEG - WTC committed 177.07% (\$36,827,424) of its appropriation with 36,723 calculated awards. This is 6,525 more awards and 19.83% more committed than at this time last year. An additional \$2,000,000 in 1314 funding increased the number of awards to more students. In 2012-13 the program had committed 157.24% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 3,451 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Tuition Grant

WTG has committed 144.39 % (\$40,240,941) of its appropriation with 14,255 awards. This is 934 more awards and 4.32% more committed than at this time last year. In 2012-13, the program had committed 140.07 % of its appropriation at this time. 2013-14 W codes were applied on June 1, 2013. When N coded awards are removed from the committed numbers, WTG has committed 123.01% (\$34,283,825) of its appropriation with 12,152 awards. Compared to last year's committed numbers with N coded awards removed, this is 1,285 more awards and 8.79% more committed. N codes may be applied to student awards for several reasons: the student is not attending the institution, the student is ineligible due to graduate level status, the student is attending an educational program that does not receive WTG funds, or the student's need has been met by other scholarships or grants.

Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - Tribal

WHEG-Tribal has committed 155.16% (\$704,725) of its appropriation with 420 awards. This is 70 more awards and 25.11% more committed than at this time last year. In 2012-13, the program had committed 130.05% of its appropriation at this time. 2013-14 W codes were applied on May 16, 2013.
