Review of Tuition Grant (TG) and Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG) Formulas

Issue

Formulas for 2005/2006 TG and WHEG were developed in January and approved at the February 18, 2005 board meeting. The appropriations used in developing the formulas were those put forth by Governor Jim Doyle in his 2005-2007 budget proposal.

As the budget went through the legislative process, appropriations for TG and WHEG-Technical Colleges were increased, and the appropriation for WHEG-UW was decreased. The appropriation for WHEG-Tribal remained unchanged.

The budget process is on-going. The budget is now back in the hands of the Governor, who has not yet indicated which, if any, veto options he may use.

Recommendation

As of July 15, 2005, the budget is still in process. Before the Board meeting on July 29th, discussions between the following three sectors: the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (WAICU); University of Wisconsin System; and Wisconsin Technical College Systems; and HEAB Staff Connie Hutchison, Executive Secretary; TG Specialist Mary Lou Kuzdas; and WHEG-Tech and WHEG-UW Specialist Sandy Thomas, will determine if formula changes are necessary.

An updated report with recommendations will be distributed at the Board meeting on July 29, 2005.

2005-2006 PROPOSED REVISION PROGRAM FORMULA WISCONSIN TUITION GRANT

Appropriation

With the finalization of the 2005-2007 Budget, there was a substantial change in the Tuition Grant Appropriation. Governor Doyle recommended an appropriation of \$22,473,700 for the 2005-2006 fiscal year, an increase of \$370,000. The Legislature appropriated \$23,429,900. This amount was not changed before the Budget Bill was signed by Governor Doyle.

This substantial, unexpected increase resulted in a new formula recommendation.

Recommendation:

Recommendation of WAICU (Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities) President Dr. Rolf Wegenke: Increase the maximum award from \$2500 to \$2700 \$2850; increase the minimum award from \$250 to \$500. (See attached letter). Additionally, there are proposed changes to the Inflation Factors and the Base Maintenance Amounts (See Table I.) The previously approved formula is illustrated in Table 2 of this document, and the 2004-2005 is illustrated in Table 3.

Recommendation of the Executive Secretary

Executive Secretary Connie Hutchison agrees with the recommendation of Dr. Rolf Wegenke.



Dear Ma Huichison:

I am transmitting to you WAICU's recommendation for an adjustment to the Wisconsin Tuition Grant (WTG) formula for the 2005–2006 academic year. This formula adjustment takes into account the funding increase approved in the biennial budget bill adopted by the Legislature and signed by the Governor earlier this week. This letter supersedes my letter of January 10, 2005 for the happy reason that more aid for students is now available than was anticipated earlier.

In recommending this formula adjustment, WAICU remains committed to the principles that the WTG should contribute a meaningful portion of a student's overall financial aid package and that the neediest students should receive the greatest share of benefits under the program. It is the unanimous position of the WAICU Board (the presidents) that, over time, both the grant maximum and the value of the average award must increase.

Based on the alternatives developed by Mary Lou Kuzdas of your staff, it is my recommendation that HEAB adjust the formula to increase the maximum award from \$2,700 to \$2,850, using the inflation factors and base maintenance amounts as specified in the attached spreadsheet.

I want to thank you and Ms. Kuzdas for your responsiveness in exploring formula alternatives so soon after the budget signing. Should you have questions or concerns regarding the WAICU recommendations, please contact either me or Mr. Paul Nelson, WAICU Senior Vice President for Public Policy.
