# MINORITY UNDERGRADUATE RETENTION GRANT 2008-2009 Annual Report

The Minority Undergraduate Retention Grant (MRG) Program was established by the State of Wisconsin Legislature in the 1985-87 biennial budget. The first award was made in 1986-87.

Minority Retention Grants are awarded to Wisconsin resident minority undergraduates, excluding first year students, enrolled at least half-time in Wisconsin Technical College System schools, non-profit independent colleges and universities, and tribal colleges. All sixteen technical colleges, twenty-two non-profit colleges and universities, and both tribal colleges participate in the program. (The University of Wisconsin System Administration has a similar program, the Lawton Grant, for students attending those institutions.) According to statutes, a minority student is defined as a student who is either a Black American, American Indian, Hispanic, or Southeast Asian from Laos, Cambodia, or Vietnam admitted to the United States after December 1, 1975.

Awards are based on financial need, with a minimum grant of \$250 and a maximum grant of \$2,500 per year. If eligible, a student may receive the grant for up to eight semesters or 12 quarters. Assignment of funds to sectors (WTCS, Tribal, and Private/Independent) is based on the minority student population reported annually by each participating school.

There were 800 Minority Undergraduate Retention Grant recipients in the 2008-2009 academic year. 326 recipients attended a non-profit, independent college or university, or tribal college, and 474 recipients attended a Wisconsin technical college. To help gauge the effectiveness of this program an annual survey is sent to grant recipients and participating schools. The survey and results are found on page 5. Tables and graphs on pages 2-9 illustrate where and how the grant money is spent, and shows the progress of the recipients.

- Table I illustrates the educational progress of grant recipients who responded to the survey.
- Table II identifies the five schools with the highest grant distribution.
- Tables III and IV break out spending by schools and student demographics.
- Graphs I and II illustrate distribution of funds by dependency status.
- Page 6 provides the student survey and the results of the survey.
- Graphs III through XI illustrate the survey results.

The data that was collected and the results of the grant recipient survey show that the Minority Undergraduate Retention Grant is very successful. Individuals who were surveyed included students who received MRG dollars during the 2008-2009 academic year. Participating schools report that 79% of student recipients either completed their degree/certificate programs or continued to work towards obtaining their degree/certificate in 2008-2009.

Of recipients who responded to the survey, 88% indicated that the grant positively affected their decision to return to or stay in school, and all respondents indicated they either have earned or are continuing to work toward a degree or certificate. Finally, over 92% of the respondents indicated that they plan on living in Wisconsin for their working career.





The majority of recipients who responded are still in school. Some are continuing their work on a degree/certificate or are working on an advanced degree or certificate. This continuing work may or may not be at the school the recipient attended in 2007-08.

Many recipients of the MRG are continuing to pursue degrees. The continuing recipients are:

- \* Transferring from a technical college to a 4-year college
- \* Transferring from one technical college program to a different technical college program
- \* Moving from a 4-year college program to a Masters Degree program.
- \* Moving from one 4-year college program to a second 4-year college program.

It is also of note that most of these students are working at least 20 hours a week if not full time while pursuing their education.


Many of these students work in heath care professions.

### 2008-09 MINORITY UNDERGRADUATE RETENTION GRANT RECIPIENTS


Recipents responded if the MRUG had a positive affect on their decision to remain in school.

### 2008-09 MINORITY UNDERGRADUATE RETENTION GRANT RECIPIENTS


Recipients who earned a degree/certificate

#### 2008-09 MINORITY UNDERGRADUATE RETENTION GRANT RECIPIENTS


Recipients anticpation to earn a degree/certificate





#### 2008-09 MINORITY UNDERGRADUATE RETENTION GRANT RECIPIENTS


Recipients's enrollment status for the 2008-09 academic year




Receipient's employment status for the 2008-09 academic year






