## 2009-2010 ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

## Annual Status Report October 25, 2010

Eighty seven percent of the freshmen awarded the Academic Excellence Scholarship (AES) in 2009 accepted the scholarship and used it to attend a Wisconsin post secondary institution. The percentage of freshman who used their scholarship dropped one percentage point from the previous year at eighty-eight percent. It may be assumed that the procedures for awarding the AES to alternates have maximized the number of scholarships used, and that an average of 88% of scholarships will be accepted by students in upcoming years.

In 2009-2010, 756 freshmen enrolled in a Wisconsin post secondary institution. Total AES funds going to these students were \$835,839 with an average per freshman award of \$1,106.

Six tables are attached, showing final figures for 2009-2010, along with preliminary data for 2010-2011.

- Tables I, II, and III present enrollment by sector (University of Wisconsin, Wisconsin Technical Colleges, and Wisconsin Independent Colleges and Universities.) These figures represent the students who received AES program funds.
- Table IV presents a grand total for the three sectors.
- Table V presents general information such as the number of scholars using their award to attend a Wisconsin college or university.
- Table VI gives preliminary information for 2010-2011 freshmen.
