Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - UW

WHEG - UW committed 123.45% (\$72,026,629) of its appropriation with 36,546 calculated awards. This is 1,113 fewer calculated awards and 6.73% less committed than at this time last year. HEAB no longer applies "W" codes to WHEG-UW. Each campus has an allocation and they determine their own cut-off point for awards. In 2012-13 the program had committed 130.18% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 3,041 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - WTC

WHEG - WTC committed 159.40% (\$33,151,748) of its appropriation with 33,035 calculated awards. This is 2,813 more awards and 1.91% less committed than at this time last year. An additional \$2,000,000 in funding will increase the number of awards to more students than what is reflected here. In 2012-13 the program had committed 161.31% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 4,140 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Tuition Grant

WTG has committed 143.19 % (\$38,474,587) of its appropriation with 13,606 awards. This is 419 more awards and 4.44% more committed than at this time last year. In 2012-13, the program had committed 138.75 % of its appropriation at this time. 2013-14 W codes were applied on May 15, 2013. When N coded awards are removed from the committed numbers, WTG has committed 133.44% (\$38,855,595) of its appropriation with 12,686 awards. Compared to last year's committed numbers with N coded awards removed, this is 377 more awards and 3.93% more committed. N codes may be applied to student awards for several reasons: the student is not attending the institution, the student is ineligible due to graduate level status, the student is attending an educational program that does not receive WTG funds, or the student's need has been met by other scholarships or grants.

Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - Tribal

WHEG-Tribal has committed 151.28% (\$687,117) of its appropriation with 408 awards. This is 63 more awards and 22.53% more committed than at this time last year. In 2012-13, the program had committed 128.75% of its appropriation at this time. 2013-14 W codes were applied on May 16, 2013.
