Wisconsin Grant - UW

WHEG - UW committed 134.36% (\$78,395,536) of its appropriation with 39,707 calculated awards. This is 2,241 fewer calculated awards and 7.81% less committed than at this time last year. HEAB no longer applies "W" codes to WHEG-UW. Each campus has an allocation and they determine their own cut-off point for awards. In 2013-14 the program had committed 142.17% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 2,963 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Grant - WTC

WHEG - WTC committed 191.68% (\$37,264,174) of its appropriation with 37,187 calculated awards. This is 482 more awards and 14.7% more committed than at this time last year. In 2013-14, the program had committed 176.98% of its appropriation at this time. HEAB has received 6,647 fewer applicants than at this time last year.

Wisconsin Grant-Private, Non-Profit

WTG has committed 153.76 % (\$41,361,369) of its appropriation with 14,556 awards. This is 309 more awards and 9.45% more committed than at this time last year. In 2013-14, the program had committed 144.31 % of its appropriation at this time. 2014-15 W codes were applied on July 18, 2014. When N coded awards are removed from the committed numbers, WG-PNP has committed 138.19% (\$37,133,098) of its appropriation with 13,103 awards. Compared to last year's committed numbers with N coded awards removed, this is 964 more awards and 15.31% more committed. N codes may be applied to student awards for several reasons: the student is not attending the institution, the student is ineligible due to graduate level status, the student is attending an educational program that does not receive WG-PNP funds, or the student's need has been met by other scholarships or grants.

Wisconsin Grant - Tribal

WHEG-Tribal has committed 176.88% (\$803,386) of its appropriation with 491 awards. This is 71 more awards and 21.72% more committed than at this time last year. In 2013-14, the program had committed 155.16% of its appropriation at this time. 2014-15 W codes were applied on July 18, 2014.
